EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK (B.S.W.) (SIX SEMESTER THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE) BASED ON THE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) IN THE FACULTY OF INTER-DISCIPLINARY STUDIES DIRECTION, 2017.

(Notified under the provisions of Section 12(8) of Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016)

Whereas, the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 has come into force with effect from 1st March 2017 (Maharashtra Act No. VI of 2017).

AND

Whereas Gondwana University, Gadchiroli is established by the Government of Maharashtra Vide Notification No. MISC-2010/(252/10) UNI - 4 Dated 27th September, 2011 as State University offering various academic programs beginning from the academic session 2012-13;

AND

Whereas, the above mentioned Act is applicable to the Gondwana University, Gadchiroli from 1st March, 2017;

AND

Whereas, the Chairman, U.G.C. New Delhi has directed the Vice-Chancellor of the University to initiate steps for successful implementation of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic session 2015-16 vide letter D.O.No. F-1-1/2015(CM) dated 8th January, 2015;

AND

Whereas, the U.G.C. has formulated and issued guidelines on adoption of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all the Universities;

AND

Whereas, the Vice-Chancellor has directed, on the basis of the resolution of the authorities, to formulate and introduce Choice Based Credit System at UG and PG level programme in all the faculties of this University;

AND

Whereas, the matter to introduce Choice Based Credit System is required to be regulated by an ordinance to be made in this behalf;

AND

Whereas, no ordinance is in existence in the University for introducing Choice Based Credit System in the Faculty of Interdisciplinary Studies;

AND

Whereas, making of an ordinance for introducing Choice Based Credit System in the Faculty of Interdisciplinary Studies is a time consuming process;

AND

Whereas, the Choice Based Credit System is to be introduced at the Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) degree level programme in the Faculty of Interdisciplinary Studies from the Academic Session 2017-18;

Now, therefore, I, Dr. N. V. Kalyankar, Vice-Chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers vested in me under provision of Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, do hereby issue the following Directions:-

1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations Leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) (Six Semester Three Year Degree Course) Based on the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Faculty of Interdisciplinary Studies Direction, 2017".
2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the academic Session 2017-18 for Ist and IInd semesters of the degree of Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) and onwards.
3. In this Direction, unless the context otherwise requires:-
 - a. "Program" means core/traditional undergraduate degrees offered under various faculties / disciplines like arts & social science, science and commerce by the University.
 - b. "Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)" means pattern of education system designed to provide choice for students to select courses of their interest from the prescribed Program.
 - c. "Semester" means an academic year comprising 180 working days in the least is divided into two equal period of study i.e. semesters, each semester having at least 90 working days. With six working days in a week this would mean that each semester will have 15 teaching /working weeks. The odd semester is scheduled from June/July to November/December and the even semester from

November/December to April/May. Each week has a minimum 30 working hours spread over 6 days.

- d. "Course" is a structured set of instructions that are imparted to a student on the basis of a syllabus or a framework decided beforehand and has the sanction of the different academic and executive bodies of the University extended over a semester.
- i) Each course is designed variously under instructions given as Lectures, Tutorials, and Practical (Social Work Practicum and field exercises). Usually these components are referred to as L, T, and P components (L - T - P). The credits for each course determine the volume of the course content. The program shall consist of Courses as outlined in the succeeding sections.
 - ii) Foundation Courses (FC) / Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): These are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement and man-making education.
 - iii) Core Courses (CC): These courses are to be compulsorily studied by a student during I to IV semesters as a core requirement of bachelors' program in the said discipline of the study. It further comprises of two courses as:
 - (1) Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DEC): these are extension courses belonging to discipline specific core courses to be opted by a student from the allowed subject combinations during 5th and 6th semester.
 - (2) Generic (Inter Disciplinary) Elective Courses (GEC): these courses may be selected from the pool of courses which will be supportive to the student in a discipline of study.
- e. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): These courses are designed to provide value-based and / or skill-based knowledge containing both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field-work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. Thus in the process, shall provide exposure to some other discipline/domain in order to nurture student's proficiency.
- f. "Credits" refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why usually 'credit' is taken to mean 'credit hours'. The credits also determine the volume of course contents and delivery of program by way of lectures, tutorials, practical (Social Work Practicum), assignments etc. Term Credit has a connotation of achievement or earning through learning effort. Credit stands for following in the context of CBCS.
- i) It also implies successful completion of a course of study measured in terms of class room instruction hours/week in

the courses being studied in that semester. It also implies learning effort required on the part of the learner.

- ii) It also measures the volume of the content to be delivered in the course being studied under CBCS for Undergraduate program. Credits of a course also indicates the weightage of a course for calculating Grade Point Average (GPA). Though credits are not directly related to marks, as a rule of thumb, we may consider One Credit point = 25 marks.
- iii) For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components as L - T - P. Each one of these components is considered as equal to one credit hour. One lecture (L) as well as one Tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one Practical (P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weightage given to a course in terms of credits will be equal to $L + P/T$, where L is the number of one hour Lectures per week, T is the number of one hour Tutorials per week, and P is the number of two hours Practical per week. This can be written in symbols as:

$$C = L + P/T$$

Where, C is the credit weightage for a particular course.

- iv) The total minimum credits required for an under graduate B.S.W. degree programme is one hundred and thirty-two (132).
- v) All courses need not carry the same weightage. The course should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A Course is designed to comprise lecture / tutorials / practical work (social work practicum) / project work / viva / seminars / assignments / presentations etc. or a combination of some of these modes of evaluations.
- vi) It also amounts to a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit shall mean one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or 2 hours of laboratory/practical work per week in a semester of 15 weeks.

Explanation:

A. Credit Hour

i. One Hour of Lecture/Tutorial

ii. Two Hours of Practical

B. One Credit (Lecture/Tutorial) = 15 hours

C. One Credit (Practical) = 30 hours

- g. "Credit System" means, the course of study under this pattern, where weightage of credits is spread over to different semesters during the period of study and the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be awarded (criterion for the Degree) based on the credits earned by the students.

4.4 Number of Theory papers, social work practicum and Dissertation:

There shall be a total 32 theory papers for the BSW programmes. There shall be five theory papers to be cover in first to forth semester and six theory papers in 5th and 6th Semester. All the papers are compulsory to all students. Social work Practicum shall be mandatory from 1st to 6th Semester. Rural Camp of 06 days duration shall be a part of social work practicum during 4th semester and study tour shall be a part of 6thsemester. The study tour should conducted within Maharashtra. Each student shall require to undertake the Group Research Project, in a subject relevant to the area of social work practice. The semester wise allocation of subject, credits and Teaching hours as follows.

Note:- “A student enrolled with BSW course who fails in Social Work practicum has to repeat the same process in the next/subsequent academic session. The performance of such students will be evaluated on the basis assessment carried out a fresh and essential records maintained by them”.

- (ii) The **passing** shall be 40% for each of the theory course/head of passing and 50% for practical (Social Work Practicum) considering all components of assessments taken together i.e. ESE/UA and IA/CA.
- (iii) The award of **Degree** of Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) shall be on the basis of performance in all the semesters of the program.
- (iv) All SGPA/ CGPA shall be on **07-point scale** only as suggested and adapted by UGC.
- (v) **Transcript** of records(Grade Card / Sheet): Every course taken by the learner is recorded on the transcript of records with the corresponding credits and the grade awarded based on secured marks. A copy of the transcripts of records depicting estimated SGPA as a measure of performance in each of the semester and a consolidated transcript indicating the performance in all semesters based on CGPA duly signed by Director, BOEE should be given to all the learners / students.

- (vi) **Provisions** in respect of any matter not mentioned in this Direction for B.S.W. undergraduate program shall be applicable as per the relevant direction / ordinance of this University in force.
- (vii) **Review:** The University can, at any time, review, alter, substitute, amend or delete any of the provisions of this Direction subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the UGC and as per any special situation arising during the operation of this Direction as felt by Academic Council of the University.
